

INTRODUCTION

loops&grids

loops&grids, which was commissioned by the Gesellschaft der Musikfreunde Wien, is based almost entirely on loops. The idea of writing "mechanical music", emerged during a lecture given by Illka Oramo about Magnus Lindberg at the Sibelius-Akatemia Helsinki. I first encountered the term "loops" at the age of thirteen, when I began using a Korg X3 work station to record pop/techno/rave/dancefloor tracks. In the course of my composition studies, I came across several compositions where loops play an important role such as Witold Lutoslawksi's 3rd Symphony, Harmonielehre by John Adams, Signature and Design by Sampo Haapamäki, as well as compositions by György Ligeti, Bernhard Lang (DW) and Magnus Lindberg. I cannot claim that I thoroughly studied these works; instead it was their sound effects that inspired me to use loops in my compositions and, in turn, to base a composition nearly entirely on the concept of loops.
